ABOUT US

Northumberland Scouts is a Scout County with over 6,000 youth members and 1,700 adult volunteers. We operate across Northumberland, North Tyneside, Newcastle Upon Tyne, Hexham and up to Berwick upon Tweed, supporting the delivery of Scouting across 105 Scout Groups, 40 Explorer Scout Units and 14 Scout Districts. Each week there are 350 section meetings at the 100+ locations where our young people meet, providing over 1,000 hours of Scouting activities for young people.



SUPPORTING ADVENTURE

Northumberland Scouts are responsible for supporting the delivery of active and adventurous programmes for 4 to 6 year old Squirrel Scouts, 6 and 8-year-old Beaver Scouts, 8 to 10-year-old Cub Scouts and 10 to 14-year-old Scouts organised in Scout Groups and 14 - 17-year-old Explorer Scouts and 18 – 25-year-old Scout Networks organised in Districts.

In all sections the focus is on the delivery of a balanced yet exciting programme with a focus on developing skills for life through outdoor activities and adventure.



YOUTH FOCUS

Though our YouthShaped initiative we reflect the fact that Scouting is a youth organisation led by young people and supported by adults. Young people are at the heart of our decision making with respect to our programme, activities, events and competitions. Young people and younger adults also play a key role in the development of Scouting in Northumberland and in our governance as a charity.

Through our peer leadership training we are also keen to support the development of the next generation of our organisational leadership, so that Scouting in Northumberland constantly remains youth led.

Skills and abilities

- Ability to effectively chair meetings both face to face and via online platforms
- Ability to be assertive and cope with challenging situations
- Ability to use digital technology well, including Microsoft Office programs (Word, Excel, PowerPoint) as well as
 email and online digital platforms including mobile apps such as WhatsApp, Zoom, Teams etc for virtual meetings.
- Ability to communicate well, orally and in writing
- Ability to listen to others and counsel when necessary

Knowledge and experience

- Experience of the effective management and leadership of volunteers.
- Experience of strategic management in a professional or voluntary capacity.
- Experience of managing adults across a wide geographical area and from various backgrounds.
- Knowledge and experience of what we do in Scouting to deliver programme to young people (this might be as a youth member, parent, or existing volunteer)

- Inspirational and able to create followership amongst other volunteers in Scouts Inspirational, energetic, and enthusiastic about the role

ROLE DESCRIPTION

This vacancy is for County Youth Lead of Northumberland Scouts, which operates in Northumberland, North Tyneside, Newcastle, Hadrian and up to Berwick. At the last annual census we had over 6,000 youth members between the ages of 4 and 25 involved in our Squirrel, Beaver, Cub, Scout, Explorer, Young Leader and Network sections. We have over 1,700 adult volunteers, who undertake roles including working directly with young people, adults who manage and support other adults, adults who are experts in programme and activity areas, adults who support elements of the programme through Scout Active Support Units, as well as the Scout Network which provides development activities for adults aged 18-25.

The County Youth Lead, working in tandem with District Youth Leads and with the option of appointing Deputy CYLs, provide leadership for Youth Shaped Scouting in the County and will be supported by the County Lead Volunteer, Peter Thorp, the County Team and County Trustee Board

Purpose of the role

As a member of the County Senior Leadership Team, the County Youth Lead works in partnership with the County Lead Volunteer and Senior Leadership Team Members to lead on strategy and the effective management of Scouting.

The role is to ensure that young people from 4 – 25 years of age are involved and engaged in every decision that shapes their Scouting experience locally, and to empower young people to share their ideas and have a meaningful voice in developing strategy, planning, implementing and reviewing their programme and opportunities.

Responsible to:

County Lead Volunteer.

Responsible for:

Deputy County Youth Lead(s), if appointed.

Main Contacts:

County Senior Leadership Team, County Trustee Board, District Youth Leads and the wider County Team.

Appointment requirements:

Aged between 18 and 25 at time of appointment. The completion of a Manager and Supporter Wood Badge relevant to the County Youth Lead appointment, within three years of appointment. Eligible to be a Charity Trustee.

Main Role Responsibilities

The County Youth Lead will support the further development of youth shaped Scouting across the County

- Working as a key part of the County Senior Leadership Team contributing and taking an active part in the delivery of the County Development Plan.
- Encouraging the creation and greater participation in meaningful District and County Youth Forums.
- Ensuring that recommendations from the County Youth Forums to the County Trustee Board and County Team are considered and appropriately implemented and that an effective method is in place to provide feedback on outcomes to the Youth Forums.
- Working with all members of the County Team to ensure that the views of young people are represented in all decision making.
- Appointing, supporting and managing a County Youth Forum Lead for each section.
- Championing and promoting youth leadership at all levels within Groups and Sections (Young Leaders, Sixers & Seconders, Patrol Leaders & Assistant Patrol Leaders etc.)
- Visiting District meetings to talk and inspire young people about youth-shaped Scouting and what is happening within their County.
- Supporting Districts (and specifically District Youth Leads) to provide local youth engagement opportunities including forums.
- Working with other adults to identify, encourage and develop talented young people and young adults who wish to become more involved in shaping Scouting.
- Providing support to 18-25-year-old members on Trustee Boards.

- Increasing the role and participation of young people in the leadership and management of the County.
- Working with other local Youth Leads to feed into the UK Youth Lead Team including taking part in national training and conference opportunities (often virtual).

Personal Specification

The County Youth Lead must:

- Have a good understanding of the principles of Youth Shaped Scouting
- Understand the importance of youth input to the development of strategies, plans activities and events
- Be able to build a positive and active relationship with the County Team, County Trustee Board and District Youth Leads
- Be enthusiastic, proactive and able to enthuse others about Youth Shaped Scouting
- Be able to travel across the County and have the
- time necessary to undertake the role effectively.
- Be able to lead project teams
- Have good written and oral communication skills
- Have excellent computer and digital skills
- Be able to work well in meetings
- Possess good presenting and facilitating skills
- Be articulate
- Have the ability to speak publicly
- Be persuasive
- Be able to work within predefined limits (for
- examples timescales and budgets)
- Accept the policies and rules of The Scout Association
- Be willing to become a member, take The Scout
 Association Promise and wear the Scout Uniform
 Accept and promote Scouting's fundamentals and
 the implementation of the youth programme



Role Share

We are looking to appoint a County Youth Lead

Potential candidates are encouraged to consider role share applications, whereby two or more persons share the responsibilities of the County Youth Lead, with each undertaking the responsibilities to which they are best suited. Applications are welcomed from a small group of people who already possess a good idea of how they could work with each other to fulfil the responsibilities of the County Youth Lead or from individuals willing to use their skills and experience as part of a small team. This may include the appointment of Deputy County Youth Leads

NEXT STEPS AND HOW TO APPLY

The process of making a recommendation for appointment to the role is undertaken by The County Lead Volunteer. Self-nominations are very welcome and actively encouraged. Nominations for the role are sought from a wide range of individuals – self nominations are very welcome. When completing the nomination form please provide as much relevant information as possible as this will assist the Search Group in considering who may be best suited for the role. Please refer to the role description and person specification to help the County Lead Volunteer understand

how the nominee meets the requirements of the role. It may be helpful to include experiences outside of Scouting that are relevant to the role such as in professional or other volunteer capacities.
